The Parish of Christ Church, St. Albans Parish Statement on Domestic Abuse

Policy for Responding to Domostic Abuse

All forms of domestic abuse are wrong and must stop. We are committed to promoting and supporting environments which:

- ensure that all people feel welcomed, respected and safe from abuse;
- protect those vulnerable to domestic abuse from actual or potential harm;
- recognise equality amongst people and within relationships;
- enable and encourage concerns to be raised and responded to appropriately and consistently.

We recognise that:

- all forms of domestic abuse cause damage to the survivor and express an Imbalance of power in the relationship;
- all survivors (regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual
 orientation or identity) have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse;
- domestic abuse can occur in all communities;
- domestic abuse may be a single incident, but is usually a systematic, repeated pattern which escalates in severity and frequency;
- domestic abuse, if witnessed or overheard by a child, is a form of abuse by the perpetrator
 of the abusive behaviour;
- working in partnership with children, adults and other agencies is essential in promoting the
 welfare of any child or adult suffering abuse.

We will endeavour to respond to domestic abuse by:

In all our activities -

 valuing, listening to and respecting both survivors and alleged or known perpetrators of domestic abuse.

In our publicity -

 raising awareness about other agencies, support services, resources and exportise, through providing information in public and women-only areas of relevance to survivors, children and alleged or known perpetrators of domestic abuse.

When concerns are raised -

- ensuring that those who have experienced abuse can find safety and informed help;
- working with the appropriate statutory bodies during an investigation into domestic abuse, including when allegations are made against a member of the church community.

In our care -

- ensuring that informed and appropriate pastoral care is offered to any child, young person
 or adult who has suffered abuse;
- identifying and outlining the appropriate relationship of those with pastoral care responsibilities with both survivors and alleged or known perpetrators of domestic abuse.

Policy for Safeguarding Adults when they are Vulnerable 2021

Parish of Christ Church, St Albans, in the Church of England Diocese of St Albans

This Policy was agreed at the Parochial Church Council Moeting held on 20 September 2011.

We recognise that everyone has different levels of vulnerability and that all adults should be offered respect and given inclusion and empowerment within the Church.

- We are committed to implementing a safeguarding policy for adults when they are
 vulnerable accepting the Church of England Policy on Safeguarding Voinerable Adults
 (Promoting a Safe Church 2006) and be responsive to local parish requirements.
- We will review and endorse all safeguarding policies annually so that all members are aware of their responsibilities.
- We will carefully select those working with vulnerable groups and these workers will
 be given appropriate support and opportunities for training.
- We will respond without delay to every complaint made that a wilnerable adult for whom we are responsible may have been harmed.
- This Parish will co-operate fully with the statutory agencies in every situation and will not conduct its own investigations.
- We will seek to offer informed postoral care to any adult who has suffered abuse.
- We will care for and supervise any member of our church community known to have offended in a manner which could affect adults who are vulnerable.
- The PCC acknowledges its responsibility for all work with vulnerable people flone in the name of the Church and requires all those engaged in such work to be properly appointed and supported in accordance with the Church of England Practice Guidance: Safer Recruitment (July 2016).

PROMOTING A SAFER CHURCH

The following policy was agreed at the Parischial Church Council (PCC) meeting held on: $20^{\rm th}$ September 2021.

In accordance with the Church of England Safeguarding Policy, "Promoting a Safer Church" (2017) our church is committed to:

- Promoting a safer environment and culture.
- Safety recruiting and supporting all those with any responsibility related to children, young people and vulnerable adults within the church.
- Responding promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation.
- Carring pastorally for victims/survivors of abuse and other affected persons.
- Carring pastorally for those who are the subject of concerns or allegations of abuse and other affected persons.
- Responding to those that may pose a present risk to others.

The Parish will:

- Create a safe and caring place for all.
- Have a named Parish Safeguarding Officer (PSO) to work with the InsumbersLand the PSC to implement policy and procedures.
- Safely recruit, train and support all those with any responsibility for children, young people and adults to have the confidence and skills to recognise and respond to abuse.
- Ensure that there is appropriate insurance cover for all activities involving children and adults undertaken in the name of the parish.
- Display in church premises and on the Parish website the details of who to contact if there are safeguarding concerns or support needs.
- Listen to and take seriously all those who disclose abuse.
- Take steps to protect children and adults when a safeguarding concern of any kind arises, following House of Bishops guidance, including notifying the Diocesan Sofeguarding Advisor (DSA) and statutory agencies immediately.
- Office support to victims/survivors of abuse regardless of the type of abuse, when or where it occurred.
- Care for and monitor any member of the Church community who may gose a risk to children and adults whilst
 maintaining appropriate confidentiality and the safety of all parties.
- Insure that health and safety policy, procedures and sisk assessments are in place and that those are reviewed annually.
- Review the implementation of the Safeguarding Policy, Procedures and Practices at least annually.

Each person who works within this church community will agree to abide by this policy and the guidelines established by this church.
